Bridgeport Hospital launches lifesaving prehospital blood transfusion program

Bridgeport Hospital recently launched a lifesaving prehospital blood transfusion program that equips regional emergency medical services (EMS) agencies with the tools and education necessary for paramedics to administer blood transfusions in their ambulances.

The program, the first of its kind in the region, is a collaboration with Bridgeport Hospital's EMS partners from Bridgeport American Medical Response, Trumbull EMS and Stratford EMS.

"When assessing and treating bleeding patients, every second matters," said Douglas Latham, MD, Bridgeport Hospital EMS medical director. "The ability to transfuse blood prior to arriving at the hospital improves patient outcomes by addressing hemorrhagic shock during the most critical time, stabilizing patients until they arrive at the hospital for ongoing treatment and mitigating the effects of severe blood loss in critically injured and/or bleeding patients."

Bridgeport Hospital wins CHA Community Service Award

Congratulations to Bridgeport Hospital for winning the 2025 Connecticut's Hospital Community Service Award from the Connecticut Hospital Association (CHA) for the Family Bridge Program.

This innovative program serves the Bridgeport community by providing in-home follow-up for new mothers and babies. Nurses and social workers visit families in their homes within two weeks of discharge, regardless of delivery hospital. The award was presented at CHA's Annual Meeting on June 17.

Know Your Numbers Plus underway

The annual Know Your Numbers Plus wellness rewards program is currently underway. The program gives YNHHS employees, including employed physicians, the opportunity to earn up to \$500 credit toward the cost of their 2026 YNHHS medical premium – and be healthier at the same time.

Completion of a basic health screening, the core of the program, earns \$300 in credit. These biometric screenings may be scheduled at onsite locations, including at both Bridgeport Hospital campuses.

TCAR procedure at BH featured in recent edition of *Healthy & Wise*

Reducing Stroke Risk With TCAR

Patient Joseph Glorioso had no idea what TCAR was, but he was more than pleased that his vascular surgeon did. This newer procedure for treating transcarotid artery revascularization – or TCAR for short – is less invasive than traditional methods in minimizing the risk of future stroke in patients at high risk for severe carotid artery disease.

Glorioso, who had had multiple mini-strokes, or TIAs (transient ischemic attacks), said he recognized the oncoming symptoms of stroke. "When I started slurring my words, my wife took me to Bridgeport Hospital right away."

"Prior to TCAR, our main way to revascularize carotid arteries was through stenting versus the standard of care, which is carotid endarterectomy (CEA)," said Seth Blattman, MD, who performs the TCAR procedure at Bridgeport Hospital. "Carotid endarterectomy has been around for about 40 years and is tried and true.

Dr. Blattman said he has been using the TCAR method for the past several years with increasing frequency in patients who are considered at high risk for traditional surgery due to age and other medical conditions.

Jazzman's Café and Pandini's under construction

Construction is underway to remodel the current Bridgeport Hospital main campus lobby eateries, Jazzman's Cafe and Pandini's, to bring employees and visitors a new and enhanced dining experience.

The upgraded dining space, scheduled to open in early fall 2025, will include modern equipment, new technology, additional menu offerings and a micromart to accommodate staff 24 hours every day.

While the spaces are under construction throughout the summer, there is temporary space set up in the lobby area (near the old parking desk) offering light refreshments including coffee, tea, water, soda, fruit cups, yogurt, pastry and other light snacks, providing quick and convenient items to customers during the construction phase.

Staff and visitors are also encouraged to visit the main cafeteria, Fresh Inspirations, located on the hospital's second floor, for a wide variety of food and beverage options.

During construction, the main cafeteria will have extended hours opening from 7 am - 7 pm, Monday through Friday (the overnight space in the main café will remain open during construction) and 7 am - 6:30 pm weekends and holidays.
